TRANSIENT LANDSCAPES AT THE NEVADA HUMANITIES PROGRAM GALLERY
Nevada artists explore how transience has shaped the southern Nevada landscape.

Las Vegas, NV – Nevada Humanities presents *Transient Landscapes*, an exhibition featuring thirteen Nevada artists, and curated by longtime cultural journalist Scott Dickensheets, on display April 2 through May 29, 2015. Dickensheets, who serves as the deputy editor of *Desert Companion* magazine, has been involved with the arts in southern Nevada for many years, and will present a special Curator’s Talk at the opening reception on April 2 at 7 p.m. The participating artists are: Jared Africa, Linda Alterwitz, Robert Beckmann, JW Caldwell, Justin Favela, Abigail Goldman, Brent Holmes, Sean Jones, Gary Mar, Marshall Schuettle, D.K. Sole, Erin Stellmon. The exhibition also includes artwork from the Vegas Vernacular Project, edited by Bryan McCormick and Geoffrey Ellis.

“Transience has shaped southern Nevada in nearly uncountable ways — from the incredible churn of residents and visitors to buildings and structures that are no longer here,” commented Dickensheets. “From social institutions that have come and gone to a sense of spiritual impermanence that, for many, permeates Las Vegas. The exhibit will examine, engage and, yes, even tickle the subject with a variety of media and approaches, from dire seriousness to utter whimsy.”

“Collaborations with creative individuals like Scott Dickensheets and the outstanding artists involved in this exhibition are exciting ways to engage with our landscapes and histories from new vantage points.” commented Christina Barr, Executive Director, Nevada Humanities. “I hope that all of the people who come to see this exhibition come away with something unexpected and new to think about.”
